NCC PROFILE

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps is an Indian Military Cadet Corps with its Headquarters at New Delhi, India. It is opened to school and college students on voluntary basis. NCC is Tri-service Organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The NCC in India was formed with the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. A committee headed by Pandit Hraday Nath Kunjru recommended a cadet organization to be established in schools and colleges at a national level. The NCC Act was accepted by the Governor General and on 15 July 1948 the National Cadet Corps came into existence.

After 1965 and 1971 Wars NCC syllabus was revised. Rather than just being second line of defence, NCC syllabus laid greater stress on developing quality of leadership and officer like qualities.

FLAG OF NCC: In 1954 the existing tricolor flag was introduced. The three colours in the flag depict the three services in the Corps, Red for Army, Deep Blue for Navy and Light Blue for Air Force. The NCC letters and the crest in gold in the middle of the flag encircled by a wreath of lotus, give the flag a colourful look and a distinct identity. Each lotus represents one NCC Directorate (Dte). The two dots represents Officer Training Academy's in India they are at Kamptee, Maharashtra, Nagapur and other at Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh.

AIMS OF NCC:

- 1) To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideas of selfless service amongst the youth of the country.
- 2) To create human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always available for the service of the nation.
- 3) To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces.

DIVISIONS OF CORPS:

- 1) The Senior Division (SD): The recruitment to senior division is from male students of the university.
- 2) The Girls Division (SW): The recruitment to senior division is from female students of the university.

CENTRAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Central government may for the purpose of advising it, on all matters of policy connected with constitution and administrations of the crops appoint a central advisory committee comprising of the following persons.

- a) The Minister of defence who shall be the chairman of the committee.

Ex-officier.
- g) The Chief of Air Staff and Commander in chief, Indian Air force,
Ex-officier.
- h) Five non-official members to be nominated by Central Government.

- 3) Work hard with Fuss.
- 4) Make no excuses and tell no lies.

WHO CAN JOIN NCC AT COLLEGE LEVEL:

- 1) Any Boy or Girl having age between 16 to 24.
- 2) Having Good bearing and physical fitness.

NCC officers' qualities are bound by certain guidelines, which restricts the behavior of an officer. Earl Chetwode says "The honour, welfare and safety of your country comes first, The honour, welfare and safety of the men you command comes next and your own honour, welfare and safety comes last, always and every time" by keeping all these words in mind all NCC activities will run.

We teach NCC cadets about some of the following qualities, he should possess. Good bearing, Decisiveness, Enthusiasm, imitiveness, justice, loyalty, truthfulness, self confidence etc. Our aim is to build up the cadet who should do the following things.

- 1) Always be courteous towards superiors.
- 2) Be loyal with other cadets.
- 3) Always wish all well, saluting should be proper and alert.
- 4) Always use polite language when speaking to subordinates.
- 5) Always be cheerful and careful in your work.
- 6) Always be smartly dressed and cheerful.
- 7) Always introduce subordinate to a superior / male to ladies.
- 8) Accept responsibilities.
- 9) Always Aim higher.
- 10) Make sound and timely Decisions.
- 11) Never slouch in saluting / working.
- 12) Be cheerful but do not be loud in behavior.
- 13) Do not get intoxicated.
- 14) Never criticize any one behind his back.
- 15) Always thank the hostess for invitations.

NCC IN G.K.G. COLLEGE:

In Gopal Krishna Gokhale College, the NCC sub-unit is established in the year 1960. After the China-Indian war in 1962, government of India made the NCC training compulsory to all the students of the college, up to intermediate level. The Battalion Commander, Officers, training staff, cadets and college Principal who form and complete this chain. This pattern of compulsory NCC was run only for five years, which is from 1962 to 1967. Our five Officers with 200 cadets each were involved in this activity for these five years.

Due to financial and other unavoidable reasons the scheme of compulsory NCC was shifted to voluntary base. In 1968 we have enrolled 409 cadets for NCC as per schedule, dividing into two companies. During the first term of 1968 our boys were connected with the 37 Mah Bn. But in the second term they were transferred to the 5 Mah Bn NCC. Our boys comprised of 132 arts, 129 commerce and 109 science students making a total of 370 with 49 girls' cadets.

Again due to increase in the number of colleges and demand of NCC from other colleges, our strength was reduced to 56 cadets with one officer.

Honorable Secretary, Prof. Jaykumar M. Desai and the Principal have been taking keen interest for the progress of our college NCC sub-unit. With their enthusiasm, encouragement and support, we march ahead with enthusiasm and discipline. He is the light-house to our cadets.

At present Capt. Dr. A. N. Basugade is working as a Associate NCC Officer, under his leadership 56 cadets (31 boys & 25 girls) are taking part in all the NCC activities.

As per the rules and regulations of NCC Act, the NCC activities are performed in the college by ANO with his committee members under the able guidance of Honorable Prof. Jaykumar M. Desai, Secretary, Shikshan Prasark Mandal, Kolhapur and the Commanding officer, 56 Maharashtra Battalion NCC, Kolhapur.
